- 2. Meeting commenced with Guest Speaker: Professor Chris Daniels.

Professor Daniels, Professor of Biology at the University of South Australia, spoke to; The impact of urban infill on biodiversity;

- The importance of engaging urban communities with nature
- Spoke about 'Benefits of biodiversity' particularly genetic species and the importance of ecosystems.
- Increases resilience and increases stability
- Adelaide mount lofty ranges area has a great deal of biodiversity
- Adelaide's climate and variable rain fall affecting biodiversity
- The rise in human population affecting individual species left on the planet; increasing in domestic and decreasing in wild, and therefore affecting the biodiversity of ecosystems.
- Affects capacity to bounce back from fires, droughts etc.
- The impact of introduced species
- Sense of place and the disconnection of "Placelessness"
- Connectedness from Traditional Custodians
- Environment as driver for social change

11. Strictly Beekeeping – Susan Lonie

- Bees have begun swarming since July. It was suggested that not all honey should be taken out of the hive due to the constant changes in the weather. Ensure hives have space for brood to expand into over this period.
- Space for honey and space for brood: an important part of swarm prevention.

There was a discussion of why Manley supers are a more popular option; mostly due to the lighter weight. Suggested manly fills quicker; full depth is sometimes half capped so slower to fill. Also, less empty cold space from manly over full depth. Other recommendations for this time of year;

- Spring is a good time to clean out a bottom board
- Replacing brood frame more often than honey frames to avoid smaller bees and disease.
